## J.C. Kellogg Foundation Makes Gifts Totaling \$165,000 to CIIS

The J.C. Kellogg Foundation has made recent gifts totaling \$165,000 to CIIS. These gifts include: \$90,000 to the Integral Counseling Psychology Diversity Scholarship Program; \$40,000 to the counseling centers for the ICP, Somatics, and PsyD programs; and \$35,000 in unrestricted support, which CIIS will use for the library relocation and renovation project.

With these gifts, the J.C. Kellogg Foundation has contributed nearly \$725,000 to CIIS, making it one of the Institute's most generous donors.
